However, as with all iron castings, they may contain trace amounts of chemicals listed on the California Proposition 65 list that are known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive health issues. With the exception of nickel (see below), these substances are not intentionally added to our castings.

	Nickel is not intentionally added to your product but may exist in trace amounts from our raw materials.
	Nickel is intentionally added as an alloy to improve the hardenability on the following part #'s:
